Judges 15 Samson's Story: The Really Strong Live Lives of Thankfulness. No doubt Samson is strong physically. He shows it by delivering himself, by doing whatever he wants regardless of what God wills or what God gives. Samson shows no gratitude for God, so even Samson's strength is limited. In the end, he needs God to deliver him. If someone as strong as Samson is limited, what about us? Our strength, in the end, must be the unending mercy of God, who still responds to the ingrate, Samson. The good news is that if God will deliver Samson, Christ is strong enough to deliver us. In that deliverance, we can act stronger than Samson by living thankful lives. That's real strength.

Next Sunday

Real Strength for Holy and Healthy Relationships. By the time we get to Judges 16 and the story of Samson and Delilah we know that Samson does not act in a godly or holy way when it comes to women, sexuality and healthy relationships. His faith does not master his desires, his desires master him. In Judges 16 we find him with a prostitute. And then we meet Delilah. Again, their relationship is marked by conflict: She deceives him. He tricks her. We can't read Samson's story without dealing with the God-given gifts of love and sex, and how we have by and large misused, dishonored, devalued and broken these gifts. We have not progressed beyond the horrible perversion of sexuality in Samson's story. We'll try to recapture today the great grace of the gospel calling us to love and beloved as Christ so loved us and gave himself up for us.
