Today

This month marks my 25th anniversary as a minister of the Word and sacraments in the Christian Reformed Church. I have preached over 2,500 times. I have been with people at their best and at their worst. I have declared the name of Jesus and his Lordship in prison cells, in hospital ICUs, at gravesides, in tears and with great laughter, too. I have made mistakes, but sometimes I have gotten it right. Most times my confession of our Savior is heartfelt and true, at other times it is spoken with my own questions and doubts in the background. I have come to understand that all of the time, when we exercise faith in the Lord Jesus, we are saying more of grace and truth than we know. This is what the centurion does as he speaks from in front of the cross, 'Surely this man was the Son of God.' We'll study this verse from Mark 15 comparing it to other confessions about Jesus in the mysterious and tragic and awesome week of his crucifixion.

We celebrate the Lord's Supper, if you are shut in and would like to receive communion, please let Pastor John or an elder know.

Next Sunday

Easter Sunday is the day of resurrection. The Easter story is a story of power; Roman might and Jewish law killed Jesus. Our Savior shouldered the curse of sin for us. Jesus goes to the cross as the powerless one: arrested, silent before his accusers, deserted.

But the weakest One defeated death and became Lord of all living. Is power an idol for us? Do we yearn to exercise control in our relationships? How do we act when we don't get our way? On this day of resurrection we find the grace to entrust ourselves to our risen Lord, and our weakness is turned to strength.

Good Friday – 'How does the power of the cross work?' someone on the worship team asked last week, referring to a song we were singing. But it's a good question of faith. Just how does the fact that Jesus sacrificed his life on a cross take away my sin and give me new life with God? We're talking about atonement. At our Good Friday service we will celebrate the richness of atonement that Jesus secured for those who believe in him. Through song and scripture we will praise the Lord and honor the Savior.

Something to Take Note of

Today in Adult Ed we will return to our discussion, led by Robin Rylaarsdam, about the controversy surrounding the Calvin professors and their discussion surrounding Human Evolution and its effect on how we look at theology and the church.
